Landcare Research, Forest & Bird and the Ornithological Society of New Zealand are asking for the public's help again this year in spotting birds in New Zealand gardens. Taking part is easy – spend just 1 hour (please note, 1 hour only) anytime between **26 June and 4 July** looking for birds in your garden, parks or school grounds, and record the largest number of each species you see (or hear) at once. Please *count* not just tick the species you observe. The photos here will help you identify most birds you are likely to see.
