## GOVERNANCE - KEY FINDINGS

- Identified four unfolding tensions:
  - how do tribes create culturally grounded global citizens;
  - how do tribes rebalance wealth creation and wealth distribution;
  - how do tribes recalibrate tribal institutions; and
  - how do tribes embed entrepreneurship and innovation within their economies?






